Dictionary of New Zealand Biography

The first volume, already published, contains over one hundred items on persons who may be regarded as having 'religious significance" both well-known and less well-known, both Christian and non-Christian. The second volume should be published next year: the third is well into the preparation stage.

Work in Progress

This section is designed to put those engaged in research on the same, or related areas, in touch with one another.

Colin Brown who retires from his post at the University of Canterbury on January 31 1993, hopes to turn a conference paper on the origins of Religious Studies in New Zealand universities into a publishable article and to fulfil a commission to write a history of the Anglican cathedral in Christchurch.

George Carter and his wife were (and probably still are!), working on their 'missionary women' project recovering the history of women, married and single, who went overseas from the Methodist Church in New Zealand, during the period 1827–1980.

<u>Janet Crawford</u> (S.John's College, Auckland), is engaged in research on women missionaries in the (Anglican) Melanesian Mission.

Allan Davidson (S.John's College, Auckland), is near the completion of his history of the College, to be issued in connection with the 150th anniversary of the College's foundation in 1993.

<u>Jane Davies</u> (Archivist, Anglican diocese of Christchurch), was granted \$1000 by the John Hendry Memorial Trust to asisst the searching for and recording of architectural drawings related to the diocese from its inception. A catalogue of these materials will be produced.

<u>Peter Lineham</u> (Massey University), is currently working on the Mormons and on other aspects of the later nineteenth century church among Maori: his other main focus is on early Methodism in England.

<u>Peter Matheson</u> (Knox College and University of Otago), in addition to work on polemic and dialogue in the Reformation period, is researching the history of "New Zealand theology".

Courses, Seminars etc.

In 1990 <u>Peter Lineham's</u> course on New Zealand religious history had 30 extramural students and was similarly offered in 1991. John Stenhouse had hopes of inaugurating a similar course at the University of Otago.

College House, Christchurch has separated its two 'wings' – the university hall of residence and its theological teaching and created and funded a separate board of trustees to administer the latter. The newly-founded enterprise is called the 'College House Theological Studies Centre". Among the year-long courses which it will offer in 1993 and which may be taken towards the L.Th diploma of the Joint Board of Theological Studies will be one on New Zealand church history.

The <u>Faculty of Theology at the University of Otago</u> has taken steps to set up a Research Centre for the study of Asian and Pacific Christianity.

Library and Archival Items

Peter Lineham writes that he has arranged for a "significant deposit" of Mormon materials from the Brigham Young University Library at Provo, Utah, to be deposited in the Alexander Turnbull Library, Peter also has available a detailed bibliography of other sources of Mormon history, most of them in various deposits in Utah

In addition Peter Lineham has deposited an "extensive range" of archival material on Brethren assemblies in the Alexander Turnbull Library. This material includes an extensive range of early Exclusive Brethren material, records of Open Brethren missionary work in the 1950s and 1960s, and records of a number of Brethren assemblies.

The Hewitson Library of the Theological Hall, Knox College, Dunedin, now has a considerable amount of material on women missionaries.

Archifacts(April 1991), contained an article by Rory Sweetman discussing the then current state of Roman Catholic diocesan archives.

Harold Turner advises that the libraries of S.John's College, Auckland and Victoria University, Wellington hold microfiche collections of material "of special value for the history of the interactions between the Christian and the indigenous Maori faiths" derived from materials held at the Centre for New Religious Movements established by Harold Turner at Selly Oak Colleges, Birmingham, England. These microfiche holdings represent some 4,400 pages on New Zealand movements and cover a wide variety of materials.

Notes and News

Jane Simpson, who has recently graduated Ph.D. from the University of Otago, will take up a post as lecturer in Religious Studies at the University of Canterbury on February 1, 1993.

The Faculty of Theology at the University of Otago has embarked on what Peter Matheson terms a "modest publications programme" which will include some items related to New Zealand religious history.
