NZ & Pacific Digital

The Library is responsible for developing and managing a large number of digital collections. The collections represent an impressive and diverse range of resources, including poetry, architectural drawings, digitised books, theses, and photographic images. The collections provide valuable teaching and research resources for both staff and students, and communities outside the University.

Anthropology Photographic Archive

The database contains a selection of digitised images from the Department of Anthropology Photographic Archive, The University of Auckland. It contains over 5000 social anthropology and archaeology photographs from New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Western Samoa, Solomon Islands and Tokelau.



Architecture Archive Images

The Architecture Archive image collection features a selection of drawings, plans, elevations and photographs from the University of Auckland's collection. The archive's holdings range from the nineteenth century to the present with strengths in the Auckland region and the modern movement.



Cuthbert Collection (Fanning & Norfolk Island)

Photographs of the Fanning Island cable station, buildings and people, and Norfolk Island scenes.



Early New Zealand Books

The ENZB database contains the full text of around 100 important 19th century books about New Zealand between 1800 and 1860. The text can be searched by keyword and the database includes an index of variant spellings.

The individual books are catalogued with direct links in Voyager, the University of Auckland Library catalogue.

THE JOURNAL OF THE POLYNESIAN SOCIETY

The Journal of the Polynesian Society



The **Polynesian Society** is a non-profit organization based at the University of Auckland, New Zealand. Founded in 1892, the Society's aim was the scholarly study of past and present New Zealand Māori and other Pacific Island peoples and cultures. It has pursued this aim primarily through the *Journal of the Polynesian Society*, a quarterly publication begun at the Society's inception and enduring to the present.

The early issues of the *Journal* contain a rich repository of indigenous texts and traditions contributed by Pacific peoples, as well as by missionaries and other sojourners, often published in local languages with English translations. Among the scholars who have long contributed articles to the *Journal* are social/cultural anthropologists, archaeologists, historians, linguists and physical/biological anthropologists working in Micronesia and Melanesia, as well as Polynesia. More recently they have been joined by sociologists, political scientists, economists and other scholars.

Early editors of the *Journal of the Polynesian Society* were S. Percy Smith, W.H. Skinner and Elsdon Best. Since the mid-1950s most editors have been associated with the Anthropology Department of the University of Auckland, among them Jack Golson, Bruce G. Biggs, Murray Groves, Antony Hooper, Mervyn McLean, Geoff Irwin, Richard Moyle and Judith Huntsman, who is the present editor.

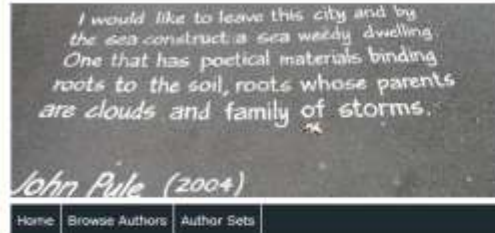

Scope

This file is a selective list of New Zealand and Pacific authors' work and provides references to biographical and critical material. The authors who are represented are generally those whose work is, or has been, studied at the University of Auckland.



INZART: Index to New Zealand Art

Welcome

Kia ora and welcome to INZART: the database which provides a guide to articles about New Zealand art. Use INZART to find information published in New Zealand art periodicals, primarily journals and newspapers, and New Zealand content in international art journals.

Journal articles are available from the Fine Arts Library or by Inter-campus Delivery Service ICIDS. To find the hard copy of an article, retain the publication details (Title, volume number, date of publication) from your INZART search results.

Press cuttings are available on request at the Fine Arts Library. To access a press cutting, copy the call number of the article from your INZART search results and ask at the Fine Arts Library issues desk. Requests are processed within 24 hours.

Access

Access to ICIDS and press cuttings is restricted to members of the University of Auckland. Articles can be sourced through major public and tertiary libraries or through inter-library loan.

Don Binney (1940-) studied at the Elam School of Art from 1958 to 1961. He had his first solo exhibition in 1962 in Auckland. He taught at Elam for an extensive period. He was senior lecturer in Fine Arts in 1979 and retired as Head of Painting in 1998.

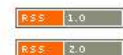
